

Map network drives on an Apple computer

Occasionally, you may have to set up a network drive for a faculty or staff member. Instructions for connecting a Mac OSX computer follow. (The example given is specifically for mapping a user's personal drive space.)

1. In the **Finder**, click on the **Go** menu and select **Connect to Server**

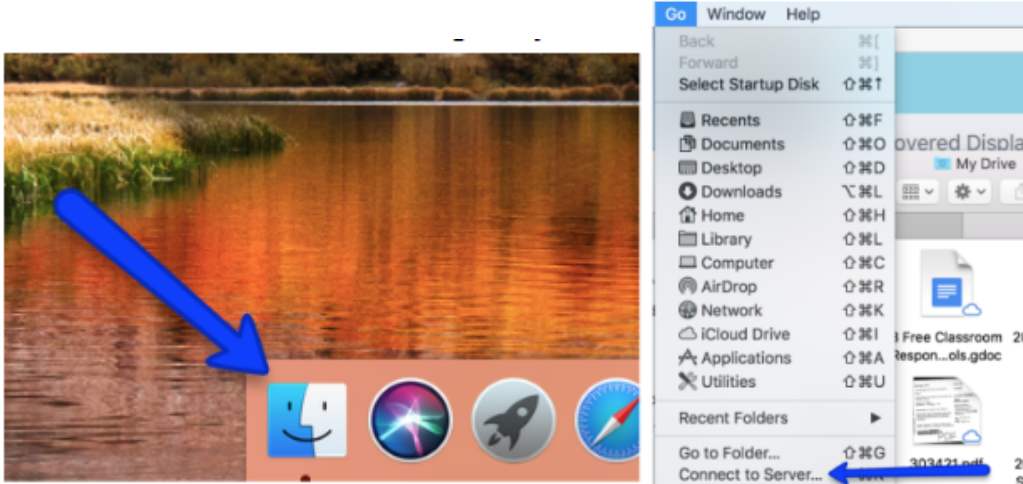


Fig 1 - Connect to a server option

1. Enter your connection path. For our network file storage, it's `smb://files.cnuadmin.cnu.edu`.
3. Click the **+** button to save the path for future reference
4. Click **Connect**

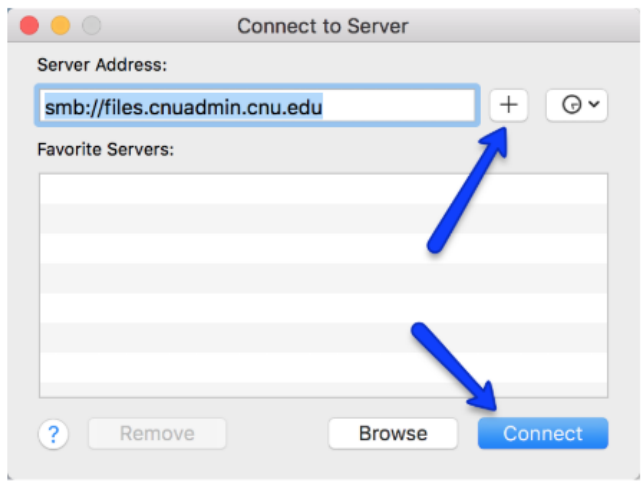


Fig 2 - Connect to your CNU Galileo path

1. Supply your credentials:
 - Username: `cnuadmin.cnu.edu\{CNU ID}` e.g. `cnuadmin.cnu.edu\01234567`
 - Password: enter your CNU password

A new icon should appear on the desktop. That is your mapped network drive.

Note: Sometimes the drive shortcut may not appear and this could be due to OSX having it set to hidden. To unhide click on **Finder** in the toolbar, select **Preferences** and then in the general section tick **connected servers**.
