




# Use Local Administrator Rights for Macs

Once granted local Administrator rights on your Mac you will have access to the Local Admin Rights tool in Self Service.

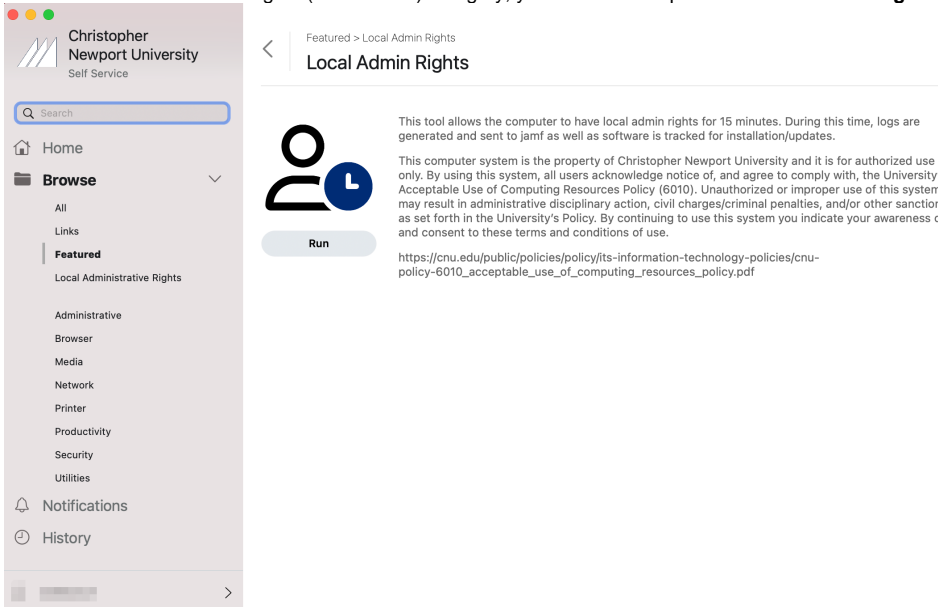

## Run MakeMeAdmin

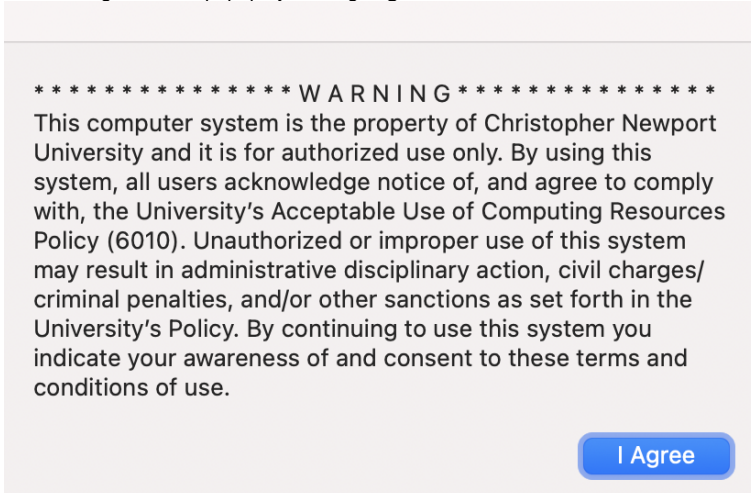

1. Open the **Self Service** application on your Mac.
2. In the Local Administrative Rights (or Featured) category, you will see the option for **Local Admin Rights**



3. Click **Run**.
4. You will see a notification with information about the Local Admin Rights policy, this is the same information you will see linked above. Click **Run**.
5. Acknowledge the next popup by clicking **I agree**.



6. You now have administrator rights on your Mac for 15 minutes.



If a process is started during the 15-minute window, it will still continue to run properly afterward.
